Our heartiest congratulations to Dr Yee Jing Foo and Dr Lok Yee Huei who recently graduated with Doctor of Philosophy degrees.

Dr Yee's study in Technology, Operations and Logistics Management, titled "Omni-Channel Logistics Chain: The Influence of Reverse Logistics Factors on Omnichannel Firm Performance" demonstrated that flexibility, collaboration, customer, and supplier have direct causal relationships with omnichannel firm performance.


Dr Lok earned her PhD in Financial Reporting and her dissertation, "Integrated Reporting and Firm Performance in Malaysia: The Moderating Effect of Board Diversity and Family Ownership" contributed to the integrated reporting literature by evaluating the roles of board diversity and family ownership in influencing the relationship between integrated reporting and firm performance in Malaysia.

Hardiness as a Shield

Dr. Gabriel Gim collaborated with scholars from Universiti Sains Malaysia and Curtin University Malaysia on a study featured in the "Employee Responsibilities and Rights Journal" indexed in the Emerging Sources Citation Index with an impact factor of 1.1.

Titled "Hardiness as a Shield: A Moderated Mediation Model of Turnover Intention Among Auditors," the research delves into the prevalent issue of high turnover rates among auditors due to their demanding workload.



Despite existing research on job stressors, the role of hardiness in mitigating these effects remains underexplored. The study, grounded in the Conservation of Resources (COR) theory, introduces a moderated mediation model to investigate how hardiness influences the impact of role overload on turnover intentions among auditors.

Analyzing data from 211 auditors using PLS-SEM and PROCESS macro, the findings revealed that the positive relationship between role overload and turnover intention is notably reduced in auditors with a high level of hardiness.

It emphasized the contingent role of hardiness in effectively mitigating the negative effects of role overload and turnover among auditors. By shedding light on this interplay, the study provides valuable insights for both academic discourse and practical strategies to address turnover challenges within the auditing profession.
